Tips for a Successful College Fair—70+ universities, comm colleges, tech schools, milit.

Before the Fair

- **Register online** at <http://gotocollegefairs.com/>. Print the barcode or download on your smart phone and bring it to the fair as your electronic ID. Saves time from filling out information cards at each table.
- **Identify what you want at your college** (major, location, size, distance from home, how selective, activities, culture of campus, athletics, diversity, cost, scholarships, study abroad focus, internship focus).
- **Review the profiles of the attending colleges** at <https://sites.google.com/site/phiscolegeandcareer/> and **compare to your list of wants**—highlight schools to visit. Be sure to include 2 new names on your list—not just the “brand-name” colleges.
- **Dress neatly and appropriately for the fair and for speaking with college professionals.**

At the Fair

- Visit the schools that match your want list. **DO NOT walk the fair with your friends or go around and pick up free pens and candy**—this is your time to talk to colleges individually and learn about their programs. If there is a line, go to the next college on your list and then come back.
- Introduce yourself with your name, year in school, name of high school, and area of interest. Ask the college to scan your barcode. This will allow the representative to follow up with you directly and quickly.
- Ask the same 3-4 questions of each representative you speak with and keep notes on each so that you can compare the answers later. **Get their business card.**
- **Talk with 2-3 colleges you do not know;** Do not talk just to the “well-known colleges”. Lesser known colleges have some amazing “hidden secrets”.

Examples of Questions to Ask Colleges

1. If you have a major in mind, ask more about the major--What makes it unique at this college? What types of research is the faculty conducting? How are the facilities, equipment, labs in my major? Is their opportunity for student research, honors program, or study abroad? Can I double major?
2. What types of internships/health care clinicals/student teaching experiences are available? When do I start?
3. What are the application deadlines for admission and financial aid? What about any departmental or institutional scholarships and how do I apply?
4. **Out-of-state colleges:** Do you offer any tuition discounts for students? Scholarships for out-of-state?
5. What is the average high school GPA of last year’s freshmen class? What was the average ACT/SAT last year?
6. What is the campus culture like?
7. **Juniors:** Do you have any free/low cost bus tours to campus? Do you offer summer programs and fin aid?

After the Fair

- **Seniors:** Review information to reduce your choices into a “yes”, “maybe”, or “no” pile.
 - **If you have NOT applied yet to 4 yr colleges, apply immediately and BEFORE Oct. 31.**
 - If you have applied, but not accepted yet, follow-up with a thank you email or note.
- **Juniors, Sophomores:** Review information to start building a list of colleges to visit and research.
